ABOUT THESE CARDS

Hey Teacher!

I am so glad you downloaded these cards! My hope with these cards that they will give you a tool to help your students discover more honesty in their work in your studio – whether that is in their vocal studies or in their acting work.

These cards are a set of 500 different verbs – or action words – that you can use with your students to help them explore their pieces. There are many different ways of using these cards. You may ask them to choose one card and have them explore a section of their piece (or even their whole piece) while doing that action. You may have them pull out 10 cards and ask them to choose which actions best fit the story of their piece and where those particular actions go – then have them explain their reasoning (great for checking not only actioning, but also their lyric / text and story analysis.) You could have them perform their piece and react in the moment while you call out different actions from the cards (great for working on being present and reactionary to their work.) The possibilities for use in the studio are really endless.

Why actions? Well, that's actually a simple answer. Actions give us something to DO. The actions we choose in a situation are based off of our life experience and thus allow us to do what we would do in a situation. These actions are things we know and understand. We don't instinctively choose actions we don't know. What we choose to do, is what makes us who we are.

Actions are important to actors because they are part of Stanislavsky's 3 things to focus on: "What Do I Want" (Objective), "How Am I Going to Get It" (Tactic or Action), and "What Stands in My Way" (Obstacle.) All of these things lead up to the ever important "Magic If" – "If I was in my character's situation – knowing what I know about their life experiences and my own – what would I do?"

You may be thinking: "This is fine Nate, but I have my emotion cards already. Why do I need these?" I would say it's really simple: We don't understand our emotions, not to mention know what we do when we feel a particular emotion, so how do we DO that in a piece? Emotions are reactions to a stimulus and as a result, not things we can truly do. We can't "happy." We can't "sad." We can ACT happy. We can ACT sad. In that situation though, what we are doing is ACTING. If the actor is acting, that means the character is acting. Unless there is a reason for the character to act like they are doing something, we should give our students – and as a result their characters - things they would really do so their work is more realistic and honest.

If we do it right, the actions we choose will CAUSE the emotions. There are two types of emotions: The ones we want to feel (Happiness, Joy, Love, Excitement, etc.) and those we don't want to feel (Hurt, Anger, Sadness, etc.) We will choose actions to KEEP the emotions we want and choose actions to AVOID or GET RID OF the emotions we don't want. The latter is why people go to therapy. We don't act emotions; we experience them and do things because of them. It is so important to help our students see that process. We don't show emotions – often times we try to hide them. We see the results of the emotions – which are also actions (ex: Cry, Shout, Smile, Flee, etc.) THAT's what we need to see in their performance.

SUGGESTIONS

- I printed my cards on card stock. It helps keep them sturdy for the long term.
- I strongly suggest printing your cards on a light color or even white. That way they are still
 easy to read. If your paper is too dark, they will be harder to read, and you may have to print
 them again.
- Cutting all of these out is a pain. You may want to use a paper cutter. If you don't have one, you may want to visit your local print shop and use theirs.
- You may want to consider laminating your cards. It helps keep them in nice shape and if you have a sick student who uses the cards, you can easily wipe them down with a sanitizer wipe.
- If you laminate your cards, cut them out first and then laminate them. That way the edges will seal. If you just laminate the paper and then cut them out, your cards may not stay in as nice of shape.
- When storing your cards, you may want to look into a small photo case or even a travel bar soap box (available at Michaels, Target, or Walmart) that keeps all of the cards in one place and protected from getting bent. You can also rubber band them together.
- I keep my cards at the ready and use them when students are feeling a little under the
 weather. It keeps them thinking about their work without having to fully use their voice.
- You can also make your own cards! If you come up with verbs you like or that your students like, you can add them to the deck! I included a blank page for you to write your own in.
- When using the actions, I really suggest using the whole phrase "TO (Verb)." To Run. To
 Hide. To Evade. This keeps the actions from being a direction and helps them think "I am
 going TO (VERB)."


